TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

Tournament Director: Mike Cooper Tournament Assistant: John Bass

Format of Play

- The tournament format is double-elimination bracket play.
- Winner side of draw: matches are best-of-3 games to 11 points, win by 2 (switch sides after each game, and after 6 points in the third game of a match).
- Loser side of draw: matches are one game to 15 points, win by 2 (switch sides at 8 points).
- Note: The Tournament Director reserves the right to change the format if warranted by the number of entries.

Call to Court

Once your name is called, you have 6 minutes (which includes your warmup) until the start of the match. Failure to appear will result in forfeiture of that match.

Officiating and Rules

- Each match will have a referee. Medal games will have referees and line judges. If you can referee, please let the tournament desk know.
- Referees will call non-volley zone violations and service faults. Players will make line calls on their own half of the court. If a player does not clearly see the ball land out, the ball must be called in. Line calls can be appealed to the referee, whose decision is final.
- Referees will announce the score before each point. Starting to serve before the referee finishes calling the score will result in a loss of serve. After the score is announced, the server has 10 seconds to serve.
- Each team will be allowed two (2) timeouts of one (1) minute per game. Timeouts can only be called when play is dead.
