



Under 18 also rising slightly.





Junior Initiatives

- **Promotion of pickleball as a Grassroots Sport** for junior players has taken "root".
- We have several clubs following structured play for their juniors and using a coaching template we have provided them for lessons. We also have them included in email distribution and a private Facebook page for updates and to share their experiences.
- **Teach the Teacher** joint initiative with our Coaches Working Group and our Director of Coaches was kicked off at the **Health and Physical Education Council** session in Lethbridge, AB. We have our first session booked for Nov 23, 2023.
- Through our relationship with **POACH Pickleball** we've continued providing an opportunity for juniors to **purchase USAPA approved Junior paddles at a subsidized cost**.
- We have **sold 165 junior paddles** this year.
- Juniors are now successfully competing in many club tournaments with **a record number of juniors participated in the Pickleball Alberta Provincial Championships** with several successfully competing in higher age and skill brackets.

Junior Pickleball - continued Dean Kroetsch



Junior Jamboree

- Our 2023 Junior Jamboree event was hosted by the Edmonton Volleyball and Pickleball Center (EVP)
- **29 registered participants aged 8-18** were divided into three groups based on skill and experience
- We had **6 volunteer coaches** that worked with the groups
- We started with a short demo of game play by the coaches and then the participants went into their group with their coaches who guided them through some skill development exercises and game simulated drills
- The participants then played in loosely organized round robin games in their skill groups with our coaches guiding their play and offering input on shot selection and strategy
- **POACH Pickleball** donated door prizes of gift cards, cooling/towels, We finished with a hot dog feast with chips and cold sodas. Cost was less than \$200

INDEPENDENT PRACTITIONER'S REVIEW ENGAGEMENT REPORT

To the Members of Pickleball Alberta

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of Pickleball Alberta which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2022 and the statements of operations, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Practitioner's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the accompanying financial statements based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements, which require us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements is a limited assurance engagement. The practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making inquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less in extent than, and vary in nature from, those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these financial statements.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that these financial statements do not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Pickleball Alberta as at December 31, 2022, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Other Matter

Comparative figures presented for the year ended December 31, 2021 were not audited or reviewed.

NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The society is incorporated without share capital under the laws of Alberta and is exempt from income taxes under 149(1)(1) of the Income Tax Act. The society's mission is to serve as the provincial governing body to promote and develop pickleball for everyone.

1. FIRST TIME ADOPTION OF ACCOUNTING STANDARDS FOR NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

During the year the organization adopted Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO). These financial statements are the first prepared in accordance with these standards. The adoption of these standards does not result in changes to opening net assets or a restatement of assets and liabilities as at January 1, 2021.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements were prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Revenue Recognition

Pickleball Alberta follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions.

Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Endowment contributions are recognized as direct increases in net assets.

Restricted investment income is recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted investment income is recognized as revenue when earned.

Membership fees are recognized as revenue as the services and benefits associated with memberships are provided to members.

Revenue from all other sources is included in revenue in the year in which it is received or receivable and collection is reasonably assured.

Financial Instruments

The Society initially measures its financial assets and financial liabilities originated or exchanged in arm's length transactions at fair value. Transaction costs related to financial assets that will be subsequently measured at fair value are recognized in the statement of operations in the year in which they are incurred.

Financial assets and financial liabilities originated or exchanged in related party transactions, except for those that involve parties whose sole relationship with the Society is in the capacity of management, are initially measured at cost. The cost of a financial instrument in a related party transaction depends on whether the instrument has repayment terms.

The Society subsequently measures all of its financial assets and liabilities at cost or amortized cost, except for investments in equity instruments that are quoted in an active market, which are measured at fair value. Changes in fair value are recognized in the statement of operations.

Financial assets measured at amortized cost include cash and accounts receivable.

Financial liabilities measured at amortized cost include accounts payable and accrued liabilities.

<u>Cash</u>

Cash is comprised of funds held in banks.

Property and equipment

The society is classified as a small organization in accordance with the provisions of Section 4433 of the CPA Canada Handbook. As a result, the society records property and equipment purchases as an expense in the year of purchase. There is no property and equipment items held by the society, and there were no property and equipment purchases during the year.

Measurement Uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Such estimates are periodically reviewed and any adjustments necessary are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

3. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The organization is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments and has a comprehensive risk management framework to monitor, evaluate and manage these risks. Management believes the society is not exposed to material risks in its financial instruments as of December 31, 2022
